

Evaluation Intern Edible Schoolyard NYC Fall 2017

About the Organization

Edible Schoolyard NYC partners with public schools to transform the hearts, minds, and eating habits of young New Yorkers through a seed-to-table education. Edible Schoolyard NYC's goal is to change attitudes, preferences, and behaviors around healthy eating, and to educate and empower children to make healthy food choices for themselves, their communities, and the environment.

In 1995, nationally acclaimed restaurateur and food activist Alice Waters created the first Edible Schoolyard in Berkeley, California, pioneering the notion that the best place to teach children the connection between food, health, and the environment is in our schools. Fifteen years later, ESYNYC was founded as a separate 501(c)3 – inspired by the philosophy and model of Edible Schoolyard Berkeley, but designed to serve the specific and specialized needs of students in historically underserved New York City public schools.

Overview

This position is an unpaid internship for fieldwork credit for the fall/winter terms. We will provide metrocard reimbursement.

Edible Schoolyard NYC is looking for a graduate level student to serve as a research assistant to help with data analysis and evaluation project planning. The position will entail analysis of survey analysis of the data using google sheets and SPSS.

Other projects could include supporting the design, implementation, and evaluation of a cafeteria taste testing program at one or more of our 7 schools.

Excellent candidates may be invited to continue working with Edible Schoolyard NYC after this analysis project is complete to assist with a survey project in the spring and subsequent analysis.

Qualifications

- Must be comfortable using SPSS to organize data, run means comparison tests, and generate descriptive statistics

- On time for all appointments
- Able to problem solve with little supervision

- Knowledge of food justice, school gardens, nutrition, or related field
- Spanish language fluency or proficiency
